Giving Thanks for Christmas

When we talk about The Christmas Story, we usually think of the accounts found in Luke 2 or Matthew 1. Sometimes we expand the idea to include Scripture in other places in the Bible that tells us about Christ's coming. For example, we call Galatians 4:4-6 the Christmas Story in Galatians or Philippians 2:5-11 the Christmas Story in Philippians or Isaiah 9:6-7 the Christmas Story in Isaiah. Each of us who has asked Christ to enter his/her heart has a personal story. So this year let's answer the question, "What is the Christmas Story according to (put your name here)?"

Everyone's story will be different, and yet, everyone's story will be the same. A good reporter asks who, what, where, when, why and how. Walk through this with me as you tell your own Christmas Story.

Who—That will be each reader—you.

What—Christ entered your life.

Where—Some of you were in church, some at home. This could happen anywhere. I'd like to hear some of the places you were when you realized your need.

When—You could have been very young, an elementary-aged child, a teen, a young adult or even an older adult. Galatians calls the "when" "in the fullness of time." God knew when you would submit to His call on your life.

Why—This has a universal answer and an answer specific to you. Romans 6:23 says, "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God." There is no one who is without the need of the Savior. Your specific "why" can range from simple realization to frantic desperation.

How—The universal answer here is "by invitation." Galatians 4:6 tells us "God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into your hearts..." The personal answer varies from a child's sincere, "Please come into my heart," to an older person's cry for a second chance at life. Either way, the "How" is by God's grace because of His mercy and your faith..
